I always tell the group I am teaching that Jesus DE--FEETED Satan. It's just a play on words, but it gives us a great visual image.

All of hell knew Satan's defeat! Jesus came to destroy the works of Satan¹, and His triumphant Resurrection proved Satan's loss and man's victory.

Satan had authority on the earth that he had acquired from Adam. When Jesus was tempted by Satan, Satan promised to give Jesus power or authority over the kingdoms of the world which he

Did you note that this song said Jesus and the saints will reign?


There are six pieces of armor mentioned by the apostle Paul in his letter to the church at Ephesus. He tells us to embrace the truth of God! Be dominated by righteousness! Always represent
